Kellogg's School Breakfast Club Fund Reopens for 2023

Kellogg's, in partnership with Forever Manchester, is offering grants of up to £1,000 to schools to help fund breakfast clubs across the UK and ensure that children who need it most receive a morning meal.

A limited number of grants are available with priority being given to schools that either:

Have 35% and above of children eligible for pupil premium funding (for England) and eligible for free school meals (Northern Ireland, Scotland, and Wales); or

Are based in an area which is classified as falling in the 10% of most deprived areas according to the Index of Multiple Deprivation.

Only one grant per school in each academic year is available.

Applications can be submitted at any time

Asda Foundation's Investing in Spaces and Places Grants Programme Opens

For a second year in a row, the Asda Foundation is offering large grants of up to £25,000 for local groups across the UK who are working to improve spaces in the heart of their local community.

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Ofwat Launches £4m Water Discovery Challenge

Ofwat's new Water Discovery Challenge is a £4 million competition for innovations that can help solve the biggest challenges facing the water sector; today and in the future. The aim is to directly support organisations with innovative propositions and facilitate their engagement with water companies.

In particular, the funder is looking for innovations that have the potential to make a positive impact for water customers, society and the environment; and succeed, be sustainable and/or gain wide adoption across the water sector in England and Wales.

Successful applicants can win up to £500,000. Up to 20 finalists with the most promising entries will be awarded up to £50,000 to develop their innovation, with a range of expert support and access to mentoring from water companies. A maximum of ten winners will be awarded up to £450,000 to further grow their innovation, receiving additional support to further accelerate their progress.

Entries are invited from any sector and all types of organisations, domestic or international. This includes private limited companies, limited liability partnerships, incorporated charities and community interest companies.

The deadline for applications is 5 April 2023 (12:00 GMT).

Asda Foundation's Investing in Spaces and Places Grants Programme

Funding for small, local groups across the UK to improve community spaces and places where local people can be together and thrive.

For a second year in a row, the Asda Foundation is offering large grants of up to £25,000 for local groups across the UK who are working to improve spaces in the heart of their local community.

In 2023, there is a total funding pot of £500,000.

Grants of between £10,000 and £25,000 are available to cover between 25% and 75% of the total project costs for projects that address at least one of the following categories:

- Building repair (external or internal) for spaces and places which already exist but are in disrepair and therefore limit the usability, safety or level of expectations for other to use the space.
- Building development to enhance a space already in use.
- Outdoor development to develop outside space for the benefit of the community, particularly outdoor spaces which benefit everyone and can be accessed by large groups of people.

Projects need to align with at least one of the Foundation's aims:

- Create and/or develop safe and inclusive community spaces for groups to meet and bring people together.
- Create or improve spaces which can be used by a range groups on a regular basis.
- Support groups to deliver long-lasting projects focused on long-term community impact.

Groups must be in a position to begin work on their project before the end of 2023.

Applications are accepted from local not-for-profit organisations with an income of less than £250,000 and unrestricted reserves below £100,000. This includes registered charities, CICs, companies, unincorporated club or association, small community groups or government entities/public bodies.

Application forms can only be obtained from Asda Community Champions, who are based in local Asda superstores. Groups can use the store locator link on the Foundation website to get in touch with their local store and speak to their Community Champion about their project proposal. Applications cannot be made directly to the Asda Foundation.

Applications will be accepted from 6 February 2023 to 19 March 2023.



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Cost of Living Support Available for Youth Organisations across the UK

UK Youth, in partnership with Pears Foundation, is offering unrestricted multi-year grants for charitable and not-for-profit youth organisations across the UK with an annual turnover of less than £500,000 to help them cover rising prices and increased costs due to the cost-of-living crisis.

Through the Cost-of-Living Fund, a total of £4.5 million is available to provide multi-year grants of approximately 10% of the turnover of an organisation per year. For example, an organisation with a turnover of £250,000 can apply for up to £25,000 a year for three years. These are intended to help bring stability to youth organisations and to help mitigate the impact of the cost-of-living crisis, ensuring groups can cover bills, pay staff salaries, and continue to operate.

Successful applicants will receive three grant payments, each a year apart.

Applications can be submitted at any time.

TRANSforming Futures Fund Now Accepting Applications

National Lottery Community Fund is supporting the five-year TRANSforming Futures project to provide solutions to the issues in healthcare and justice for transgender people across England.

The focus of the Fund is communities-led, grassroots organisations that are led by and for trans people. Broader LGBTQ+ organisations undertaking trans-specific activity that is being run by trans people will also be considered.

Projects should seek to improve existing outcomes, make changes to current systems or pursue different kinds of systems altogether.

There are three areas in which grants will be made:

Healthcare.

Criminal Justice.

Under 18s (with a focus on health and justice).

There is a funding pot of £100,000, from which grants of up to £25,000 will be made.

The deadline to apply is 20 March 2023.

Biffa Award - Community Buildings

Grants are available for not-for-profit organisations to provide and improve community buildings that are located within the vicinity of a Biffa operation in order to 'act as mechanisms' for community involvement.

You must live within 10 miles of an active Landfill site.

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Co-op Foundation's Carbon Innovation Fund – New Focus for Round 2

The Co-op Foundation has published the guidance notes for the second round of its £3.5 million Carbon Innovation Fund.

The new round of funding will deliver against the sustainability element of the Co-op Foundation's youth-led vision and strategy by focusing on creating a more equitable and sustainable food and farming industry.

Grants of between £75,000 and £200,000 will be awarded to organisations working to reduce the UK's reliance on soy animal feed and/or synthetic fertilisers.

Examples include, but are not limited to:

Alternatives to soy-based animal or fish feed.

Alternatives to synthetic fertiliser, or ideas which would reduce their negative impacts.

On-farm trials of alternative feed or fertiliser which will measure success and impacts on measures such as yield, costs, biodiversity increases, nitrogen management, etc.

Thinking laterally to reduce reliance rather than create alternatives such as breeding new strains of crops, better nitrate management on farm, building multi-stakeholder networks to tackle issues together, agroecological cluster demonstration projects, etc.

Funding can be used on project costs, core costs/overheads and capital costs. Projects must start within six months of receiving the grant, but thereafter can be spent over any time period.

It is expected that roughly 10 organisations from across England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland will be funded.

The Co-op Foundation is running a free webinar on 1 February (11:00 to 12:15) where it will share more information on the Fund and how to apply as well as providing an opportunity for groups to ask questions. Groups will need to reserve a spot on eventbrite.

Round Two will open for applications on 1 February 2023 (after the event concludes at midday) and close on 28 February 2023 (midday).

Austin and Hope Pilkington Trusts Opens for First Round of the Year

Registered and exempt charities in the UK can now apply for a grant of £1,000 to help tackle social disadvantage and support vulnerable individuals.

The Trust operates a three-year rotation system, with different fields of interests being funded each year.

During this round, the focus is on rehabilitation of prisoners, ex-prisoners and those at risk of offending.

Organisations must have an operating income of between £100,000 and £1 million to be eligible to apply.

The funders recognise that Black Lives Matter has highlighted discrimination faced by the Global Majority.

Across each grant round, applicants will be asked to detail how their project addresses these issues. **The deadline to apply is 28 February 2023.**

Netflix Opens Documentary Talent Fund for 2023

Netflix is once again providing the Documentary Talent Fund to identify and support emerging documentary filmmakers from the UK and Ireland. With funding and professional support, five filmmakers and their teams will gain the experience of working to turn their short documentary ideas into completed films. The brief for these fully funded short documentaries is "On the theme of Connection".

The prize is to make a film with a budget of £30,000 (equivalent in Euros for Ireland based participants).

Within each film's budget, teams must ensure that filmmakers and everyone involved in the production are fairly paid. In their finished form, each documentary must be 8-12 minutes long.

The deadline for applications is 16 February 2023 (13:00 GMT).



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Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) Programme South Tees

2023 Application Process Guidance

This guidance is for HAF Clubs aimed at working with children and young people of primary and secondary school age.

Introduction

We have now had over 2 years of the HAF programme being delivered locally. The success of the programme has been due to the great partnerships that have developed with providers, the hard work of those delivering the programme and the sharing of lessons learned.

We will continue to allocate the funding equally between primary age provision and secondary age provision, and within this we have allocated funding specifically for SEND provision for both age groups. Please carefully consider your focus when applying.

A grants panel will consider all fully completed applications that are submitted. Mapping of provision, in line with local needs, will support the grants panel when considering applications.

Background

The funding for this programme comes from the Department for Education (DfE) and was given to Local Authorities to ensure free holiday provision, including a nutritious meal, available to all school children eligible for benefit related free school meals. Over 2023 we are looking for organisations to help deliver this programme at the Easter, Summer, and Christmas holiday

periods; you don't need to have delivered in a previous programme to apply for this funding.

The Model

Proposals must provide an offer whereby an eligible child can access HAF provision:

- Easter – Minimum of 4 hours per day x 4 days during the Easter Holiday period.
- Summer – Minimum of 4 hours per day x 16 days during the Summer Holiday period.
- Christmas – Minimum of 4 hours per day x 4 days during the Christmas Holiday period.

We want to ensure that there is a wide offer, full of variety and opportunity, available to our children and young people.

Therefore, we are welcoming applications from providers to apply for funding to deliver HAF programmes for all or one / two of the named delivery periods, that offer a model / provision that contributes to the overall programme. A minimum of 2 hours per day x 1 day during the named school holiday periods is the least that can be considered. This could be provided by a group of organisations or independently – collaborations are welcomed.

Holiday periods for schools can differ, therefore we encourage providers to consider this when developing their offer and application.

Providers are welcome to bid for funding for multiple HAF Clubs. For example, in the past some providers have delivered two HAF Clubs a day (e.g., morning and afternoon) – in this instance, these should be for different cohorts of children. If in doubt, please email us to discuss.

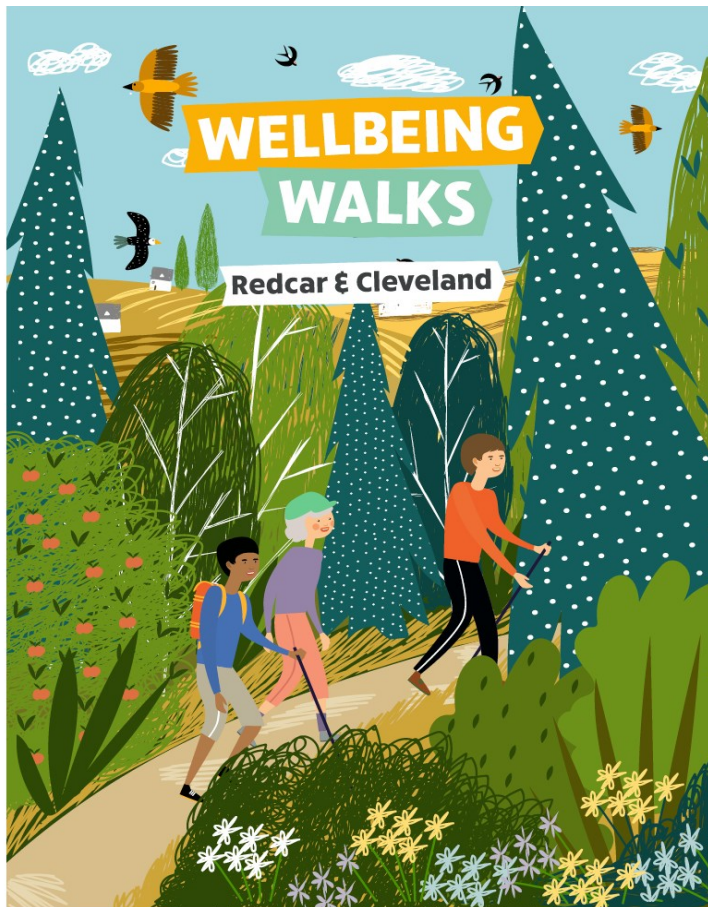

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Wellbeing Walks

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FAQ's

How long do the walks last?
Redcar and Cleveland Wellbeing Walks have a three tier grading system.
Level 1 – approx 30 mins
Level 2 – approx 60 mins
Level 3 – up to 90 mins
Walks do vary on the speed of the group and the location of the walk. Walks start on time so we advise you to arrive a little earlier than the advertised start time.

Are the walks guided?
All of our walks are run by trained and experienced Walk Leaders who are very friendly and knowledgeable.

Is there a cost?
All walks are FREE of charge; however, you may want to bring a few pennies along as some walks do finish close to local cafés.

How do I sign up?
Simply turn up! We have no booking system, all we ask is you arrive slightly earlier than advertised and be suitably clothed for the walk.

Do I need to be super fit to attend?
No, the idea of all our Wellbeing Walks is to have fun, meet new people and improve the health and wellbeing of everyone taking part.

What should I wear?
